The University of Saskatchewan Engineering Students' Fund (USESf) is a fund that will be used to advance the engineering undergraduate student experience by distributing funds to student groups and individuals within the engineering undergraduate community. The USESF would be funded by two primary sources of income: a mandatory \$20/term fee from each engineering undergraduate student, and an annual donation of \$20,000 from the College of Engineering.

A referendum to decide on whether the undergraduate students wish to implement the USESF is THIS WEEK, with voting opening on Wednesday. All undergraduate students are able to vote in this referendum and should have received an email about it. See the poster for the referendum on the next page for more details.

The referendum also has a forum on Monday (Nov. 18th) in the Eng Lounge (1C10) at 1:30pm. Come by to ask questions and raise concerns!
